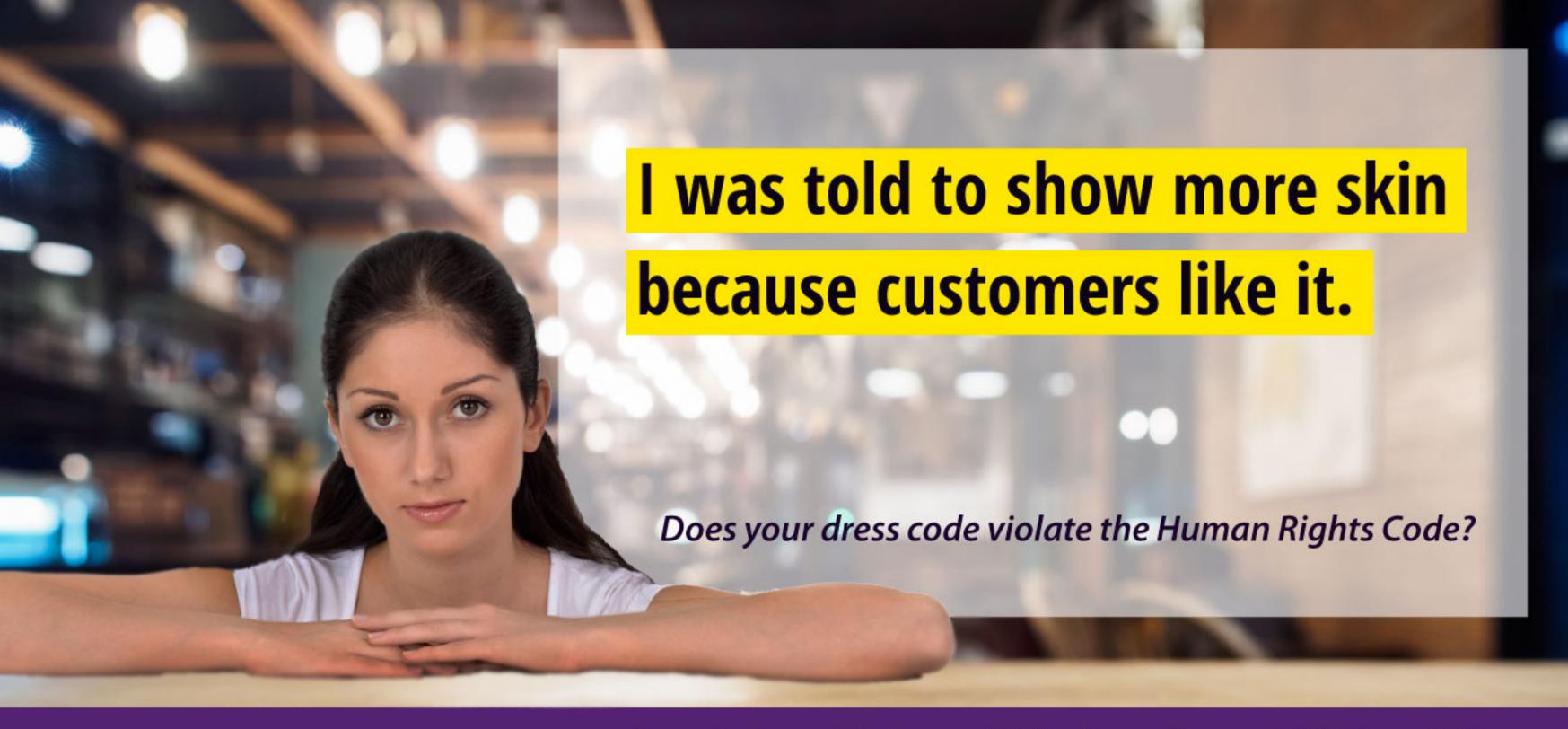
## Challenge sexist dress codes.

- 4. Ask your co-workers to co-sign a letter to your employer. Enclose the OHRC's policy position.
